## ABOUT THE EXHIBIT

The information in this exhibit was compiled with the help of Jim Bertrand, certified Shroud of Turin presenter, along with scientific studies and observations from the Turin Shroud Center of Colorado. Images used are primarily from a photographer of the Shroud of Turin Research Project (STURP). More information and a detailed book of the studies can be found at www.shroudofturin.com

#### a) Reserving the Exhibit

Please reserve the exhibit 4-6 weeks in advance. It may be reserved for up to 2 weeks. To inquire about availability, please call 855-571-0200 or email kvss@kvss.com. Official requests must be made online at spiritcatholicadio.com/shroud-booking

### b) Cost

The exhibit is free to reserve and must be free admission for those who wish to view it. Donations to cover the cost of exhibit maintenance are welcomed and encouraged. A free-will donation box is included with the display and we ask that you place it on a small display table near the exhibit. Funds collected are used for the upkeep of the exhibit and for printed materials.

### c) Presenter (Optional)

Jim Bertrand is a retired science teacher at Pius X High School in Lincoln, is the Director of Field Operations for the American Confraternity of the Holy Shroud, a friend of Dr. Jackson (STURP) and an experienced presenter on The Shroud of Turin. As part of his presentation, he brings a life-size <u>replica</u> of the Shroud. Any school, parish or other group who would like to host Mr. Bertrand's Shroud presentation should contact him at besaints2@gmail.com or 402-421-7656. This is not part of the Spirit Catholic Radio exhibition, however, combining his presentation with the exhibition is a beneficial addition.



#### d) Pickup/Drop off and Transport

This is the responsibility of the requestor. Materials can be picked up at the Omaha studio during normal business hours and can be arranged by contacting Spirit Catholic Radio staff. All staff can be contacted by calling 402–571–0200. The 42 panels exhibit will fit in most mid-sized vehicles with seats folded down. Items include: 3 large golf bags with exhibit panels and stands, and a suitcase/crate of free handout materials, prayer and donation boxes.

If you would like additional items, such as the display cases of replicas and the high definition prints (see page 6), then it is recommended to transport the display with a truck, large SUV, or a van with the seats down.

#### Sign the "Acceptance of Stewardship, Care & Responsibility" Form at Pick-Up

When you arrive at the Omaha Spirit Catholic Radio Studio to pick-up the reserved exhibit for your parish or organization, you will be required to read, acknowledge and sign the "Acceptance of Stewardship, Care & Responsibility" form before the exhibit can be released and entrusted to your care. It is expected and appreciated that you take proper care of the exhibit, as well as repack it and return it in the same manner AND condition as it was received. **PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW YOUTH UNDER AGE 15 TO HANDLE, SET-UP OR TAKE DOWN THE EXHIBIT.**

#### Complete the "Proper Care, Packing & Return Checklist" Form Before Returning Exhibit

When you return the exhibit to the Spirit Catholic Radio studio where you picked it up at, you will be required to provide us with your completed and signed "Proper Care, Packing & Return Checklist" form to ensure the exhibit is properly repacked in an acceptable manner and returned in good condition. We will ask you, before you leave the Spirit Catholic Radio station, to take time to review this form with us, together, so we can inspect the exhibit and the manner in which it was repacked and returned. Please kindly let us know immediately if any stands, exhibit panels, pieces or parts are broken, damaged or missing.

## DISPLAY SPECIFICS

#### Panels


- There are 42 (2x5') vinyl panels sequentially numbered for easy arrangement.
- Packing: The panels should be laid flat and stacked (in sequential order) in 4 separate piles with about 10 panels in each stack. Each stack should be rolled up and secured by rubber bands. They should be packed carefully into the three provided golf bags.

#### Stands

- Each display panel comes with its own x-frame stand.
- Packing: Stands should be repacked in their individual cases (feet first) before placing them in the golf bags. Evenly distribute the stands into each golf bag. The stands are fragile so please be careful and be sure to note any broken or missing pieces upon return of the exhibit. Keep broken stands separate.

### A SSEMBL Y

- Remove the 3 stand pieces from their individual bag. Assemble the stand by inserting the two poles into the main frame.
- Use caution and be gentle with the stands, as they are susceptible to breaking/ cracking. Sometimes the balls of the feet will fall off or the thin metal piece will detach from the legs. Just simply plug the balls of the feet back on and re-insert the metal piece into the legs to hold the legs together.
- Hook the banner onto the stand poles and legs.




## PACKING UP

#### Panels

- Lay Flat and then stack in sequential order. Separate into 4 groups (about 10 panels in each grouping)
- Roll up the groups separately and rubber band both ends to secure the panels
- Pack the panels into the golf bag first, setting the panel bundle at the bottom of the bag so the bag is bottom-heavy. One of the bags will have two bundles. Put one bundle in bottom of bag and the other bundle above it (as pictured below).

#### Stands

- Place stands in individual bags (feet first)
- Split evenly between the 3 golf bags and pack on and around the panels. For best fit, alternate the direction of the stands.
- 🛏 Keep broken stands separate.



## ADDITIONS TO THE DISPLAY


Additional items to reserve with the 42 panel display include 2 display cases, containing replicas of the Crown of Thorns, Whip, Holy Sponge, and Nails. The cases are made of plexiglass and wood. 1 case weighs about 25 lbs. Dimensions: 30″ x 30″



Also available for reservation are high definition prints of the Shroud. There are 11 prints total. Nine of them are 18"x24" and use table-top easels for display. Two of the prints measure 24"x48" and are framed. The easels will come with the prints, provided by Spirit.



## ADDITIONS TO THE DISPLAY CONTINUED ....



We also have a 10' x 10' image of the Shroud that can be hung up in a large room. It makes quite the dramatic statement! Spirit Catholic Radio provides piping that can be inserted into the image so it can hang nicely.

## MANAGE YOUR EXHIBIT

It is a good idea to be mindful of where and how you set up The Man of the Shroud exhibit. You will need a reasonable amount of space for the exhibit as it includes 42 2'x5' vinyl panels. You will also need a small table for display-related materials.

Many parishes set up the exhibit either in their church hall, narthex or school gym. When setting up the exhibit, remember to place the panels in proper sequential order. See page 7 of this Guide for more details as well as a properly-ordered list of the panels.

#### Set Up a Small Display Table Near the Exhibit

You will need a small display table (e.g., 4'x4' or a 6'x6' table is a good size) for the free materials and items listed below that are provided by Spirit Catholic Radio as part of the exhibit. We suggest you cover the table with a nice-looking table cloth and place the table near the entrance of the exhibit.

## OFFER HELPFUL FREE MATERIALS PROVIDED BY SPIRIT CATHOLIC RADIO


You will need a small display table for the free materials and items listed below provided by Spirit Catholic Radio as part of the exhibit. Materials come in a suitcase or crate accompanying the display. We suggest you cover the table with a nice-looking tablecloth and place the table near the entrance of the exhibit. Return unused items, prayer box and donation box with the display and pack carefully. Be sure not to shove or squish items, as they may break in transport. These materials may include the following resources:

**The Man of the Shroud Panel Guide Cards** – These handy cards list out the topics of each panel so you can find the information you're looking for in the exhibit. It also features a summary of evidence that people can take with them and continue to reflect on.

**The Man of the Shroud Prayer Cards** – These holy cards feature a Shroud image on one side. On the reverse side is a prayer for faith, reflecting on the Shroud.

**Spirit Catholic Radio Program Guides** – These helpful guides outline the most popular programs heard on-air on the Spirit Catholic Radio network and encourage people to tune-in and listen!



#### Prayer Request Box with Prayer Cards

Our staff at Spirit Catholic Radio remembers these prayer intentions during our weekly staff prayer before the Exposed Blessed Sacrament each Tuesday morning at 9:30 a.m. in our beautiful Chapel of the Word Incarnate.



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#### Exhibition Viewing Signage

Once your event is booked and confirmed, Spirit Catholic Radio will provide you with a pdf of 8 ½ x 11 signs that you can print and post in your exhibit area to help visitors know where to start viewing the exhibit and which direction to proceed as they view each of the apparitions . ## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Is the actual Shroud included in the exhibit?

Unfortunately, no. The Shroud is kept in a climate-controlled container at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Turin, Italy. It is rarely available for viewing to the public. However, there are replicas available for viewing. Jim Bertrand in Lincoln, NE has a replica which he brings to his presentations. Any school, parish or other group who would like to host Mr. Bertrand's Shroud presentation should contact him at besaints2@gmail.com or 402-421-7656.

#### How big is the exhibit?

The exhibit includes 42, 2'x5' vinyl panels. There are additions to the display such as display cases holding replicas of the Crown of Thorns, whip, Holy Sponge, and nails. Also available to add are 11 high definition prints of the shroud and a 10'x10' wall hanging Shroud image.

#### How many days can I reserve the exhibit?

Up to two weeks.

#### Will you send me a promotional flyer?

Yes, we will e-mail a full-color, editable flyer. It is up to the requestor to fill in display dates, location and parish info. The requestor will also be responsible for printing and hanging the flyer.

#### Will you send me a bulletin announcement and a pulpit announcement?

Yes, we will email the text which can be copied into the bulletin along with the flyer.

#### How big of a car do I need to transport the exhibit?

The materials will fit in the back seat of most vehicles with seats laying down. There are three golf bags which contain the stands and panels, plus a suitcase or crate which contains free materials to be displayed on a small table near the exhibit entrance. If the display cases and high definition prints are also requested, the requestor will need to bring a large SUV or van with the seats down, or a truck.

#### Where do I pick up and return the exhibit?






